

March 11, 2026

Sharpsville Borough Council met in Regular Session on Wednesday, March 11, 2026 at 7:00 PM in Council Chambers at 1 S. Walnut Street, Sharpsville, PA.

Mayor Gill offered a brief prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance was said by all.

Roll Call: Roll call showed the following present: Casey Anglin, Tom Patton, Chris Combine, Nick Hanahan, Bob Piccirilli, Kim Fryman and Len Grandy

Also present were: Solicitor, John Alfredo, Mayor, Mark Gill and Borough Manager/Secretary Ken Robertson

Approval of Minutes: A motion was made by Councilman Fryman and seconded by Councilman Piccirilli to approve the minutes of the Workshop Meeting Minutes on February 9, 2026 and Regular Session Meeting Minutes on February 11, 2026. Motion Passed.

Comments from the Audience:

Paula Cain, 222 High Street: She attended the meeting to follow up on the status of the “chicken ordinance” and to advise Council that the neighbors have now added two (2) turkeys or hens to their property. She stated that Borough Manager Ken Robertson and Councilman Hanahan have also seen the animals.

Alex Hartwick 212 High Street: He attended the meeting to discuss concerns regarding the neighbors and the number of animals they currently have on their property. He stated that they have five (5) dogs, numerous cats, chickens, and now two (2) turkeys or hens. He also mentioned that the residents are not keeping up with the removal of animal feces and that garbage is scattered throughout the yard and driveway. He expressed concern that these conditions could attract rodents and that the overall appearance negatively impacts the neighborhood.

Ken asked Alex whether the front yard had been cleaned up, and Alex responded that it had been cleaned “a little.”

Council President Grandy advised those present that the ordinance will be advertised soon and expressed hope that the matter will be addressed once the ordinance takes effect.

FNB Wealth Management-Tracey Wilson & Tony Tebaldi: Tracey and Tony were in attendance to provide an overview of the Police Pension Plan. Tony provided a handout and reviewed key points with those present.

- Iran War: Tony explained that the market reacts to situations such as war, which can influence market behavior.
- No Hire / No Fire: He noted that many companies are responding to the situation by maintaining current staffing levels rather than hiring or laying off employees.
- Market Status: The market is currently “flat.”
- Police Pension Plan: Tony stated that the Police Pension Plan remains strong.

Tony also reviewed the stock options currently being utilized within the plan.

Monthly Department Reports: A motion was made by Councilman Piccirilli and seconded by Councilman Hanahan to accept the Monthly Department Reports from the Code Office, Fire Department, Police Department, Health Office and Public Works. Motion Passed.
